This year has been another successful year for the Australian Women Donors Network. We have strengthened and expanded our influence in the sector and beyond.

We have:

- 1. Presented several well received events including:
- The Community Impact of Investing in Women and Girls an address by Dame Julia Cleverdon DCVO CBE (in partnership with the Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation).
- International Giving Through a Gender Lens session at the 2014 Philanthropy Australia Conference
- The X-Factor. Putting Sex and Gender under the Microscope in Medical Research. (with the support of Perpetual)
- Funding Indigenous Women & Girls with Gender and Cultural Wisdom (with the support of the Myer Family Company)

2. Catalysed

- The establishment of two new Giving Circles through our 2013 Australia-wide tour with Colleen Willoughby known in the USA as the Mother of Giving Circles:
 - Brisbane: Women for Change
 - Melbourne: Melbourne Womens Fund, specifically targeting women and families.
 - Perth: While 100 Women was already established, our efforts have strengthened their numbers.
- The decision by Our Community to integrate a gender lens into its SmartyGrants Online Application Forms which are widely used by Local Government authorities.

Over the past 12 months, we have made great in-roads in our ongoing mission to inform, inspire and enable greater investment in women and girls.

EVENTS

Dame Julia Cleverdon DCVO CBE Oration: The Community Impact of Investing in Women and Girls

Our Annual Gender-wise event was delivered in Melbourne in April and was presented in partnership with the Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation to a large audience of individual donors, trusts and foundations. Dame Julia was enthusiastic in her endorsement of our work, in particular our Guide to Gender-wise Philanthropy and efforts to integrate the gender lens across the philanthropic sector.

Melbourne Women's Fund Launch

Following the success of our 2013 International Speakers Tour, with Colleen Willoughby promoting the establishment of Giving Circles, we have been delighted to see these sprouting around the country. In July, a new giving circle, the Melbourne Women's Fund was launched. This local initiative is designed to attract new players to philanthropy in support of women and families in

Inspired by the seeding of Impact100 in Australia, the Women Donors Network has lead the charge for collective giving by women and congratulates the Women For Change Giving Circle in Brisbane and the 100 Women Giving Circle in Perth.

Women Donors takes the stage at the G(irls)20 Summit

In what was a great honour for our Network, I was invited to MC the two day G(irls) 20 Summit at the Sydney Opera House in August. This impressive Canadian philanthropic initiative mirrors the architecture of the G20, bringing together young women delegates aged 18-22 from each of the G20 countries plus Afghanistan, Pakistan and the MENA region, to develop them as future leaders of change in their respective countries. It is designed to influence the G20 Agenda ensuring the views of young women are taken into account in the discussions and decisions around economic development. It was very

Gender on the agenda at the inaugural Good Pitch² in Australia

In what was among the most exciting philanthropic initiatives of 2013, Good Pitch² launched in Australia with a hugely successful event at the Sydney Opera House on the 8th of October, where \$2m dollars was raised in support of 7 documentary films in 8 hours. NEXUS Global Youth Summit

Having presented at the inaugural Nexus Global Youth Summit held in Sydney in 2013 alongside Farah Mohamed, Founder & President of G(irls) 20, it was an absolute pleasure to attend the 2014 Summit in Melbourne. In what is a first in the sector, the Organising Committee ensured that a gender lens was applied to every session of the 2-day Summit. The Women Donors Network congratulates all involved who readily embraced this focus and provided outstanding leadership in Gender-Wise Philanthropy and Social Innovation.

as a Board Director of both the Women Donors Network and the International Women's Development Agency. Changing Lives Over Lunch

Continuing our tradition of bringing donors together to inform, inspire and enable gender-wise giving around different philanthropic focus areas, we presented two lunchtime workshops to examine the key issues in philanthropy for:
